

Kidney Health Evaluation for Patients with Diabetes (KED)

Measure Description

The percentage of members 18 - 85 years of age with diabetes (type 1 and type 2) who received a kidney health evaluation, defined by an estimated glomerular filtration rate (eGFR) **and** a urine albumin-creatinine ratio (uACR), during the measurement year.

- The measure is a weight of **(0.5)** star and is part of the **STARs P4P Incentive Program**

Measure Requirements

- At least one eGFR is required during the measurement period
- At least one uACR is required during the measurement period
 - The uACR is identified by the member having both a quantitative urine albumin test and urine creatinine test with service dates four or less days apart
- Care must be captured administratively for the KED Measure. Medical record submission will not count.

Call to Action

- ✓ **Routinely** refer members with a diagnosis of type 1 or type 2 diabetes out to have their eGFR and uACR.
- ✓ **Follow** up with patients to discuss and educate on lab results.
- ✓ **Educate** on how diabetes can affect the kidneys and offer tips to your patients on preventing damage to their kidneys.
- ✓ **Coordinate** care with specialists such as an endocrinologist or nephrologist as needed.
- ✓ **Order** and **Request** labs to have members complete prior to appointment to allow results to be available for discussion on the day of the office visit

Exclusions

- Members with evidence of End Stage Renal Disease (ESRD)
- Members who were on dialysis will not be included in the measure
- Members receiving Palliative Care.
- Members in hospice or using hospice services.
